I built houses and planted vineyards for myself. I made myself gardens and parks and planted in them all kinds of fruit trees.... I also gathered for myself silver and gold and the treasure of kings and provinces.... And whatever my eyes desired I did not keep from them. (2:4-10)

It is not wrong to ask questions, but it is not our place to pass judgment; the temptation is for us to try to pass judgment on God.

The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. For God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil. v.13,14

...whatever God does endures forever.... God has done it, so that people fear before him. (3:14)

Guard your steps when you go to the house of God.... God is the one you must fear. (5:1,7)

In the day of prosperity be joyful, and in the day of adversity consider: the one who fears God shall come out from both of them. (7:14,18)

I know that it will be well with those who fear God.... (8:12)

For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. (Job 19:25)

many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. (Dan. 12:2)

Solomon reminds us that God is our Creator and our Judge; remember your place: God is judge, and we are not. Ultimately, God alone is able to judge between good and evil.

God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil. v.14

There are all sorts of things that we can't possibly know or understand; we have to remember our place: our place is under God.

do not pronounce judgment before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. (1 Cor. 4:5)

We have to humble ourselves before God as our Creator; we have to humble ourselves before God as our Judge.

...that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus. (Acts 2:16)

...it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment... (Heb. 9:27)

..."he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed...."
(Acts 17:31)

Our place is at the foot of the cross, where Christ was judged for us; the bottom line: we need to humble ourselves before Jesus Christ.
