I am very dark, but lovely, O daughters of Jerusalem... Do not gaze at me because I am dark, because the sun has looked upon me. My mother's sons were angry with me; they made me keeper of the vineyards, but my own vineyard I have not kept! (1:5,6)

Marriage and romance inevitably bring together two different people from different backgrounds.

We have to be realistic about the practical challenges that come with bringing any two people together.

Oh that you were like a brother to me who nursed at my mother's breasts! If I found you outside, I would kiss you, and none would despise me.
